

CAT GRASS

AN EASY, LOW-OVERHEAD PROJECT
FOR FUNDRAISERS & SHELTER ENHANCEMENT

MATERIALS & TIME

Cans Easily sourced from your shelter's kitchen, donated by volunteers, or collected via public can drive.

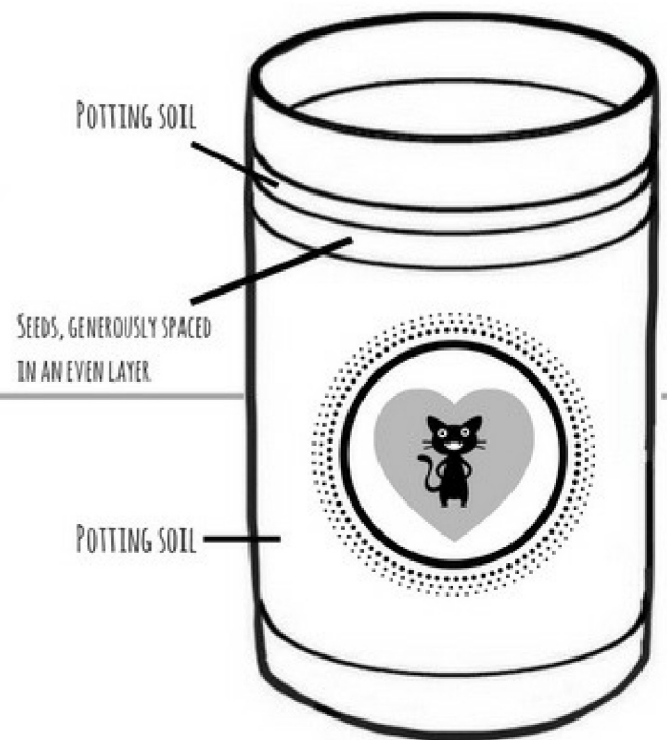
Soil With small containers like these, fine soil is best. Coarse or mulchy soil is difficult for new roots to grip, and plants will be torn out easily.

Seeds Oat grass germinates within a few days, and grows several inches tall within a week of planting.

Plastic wrap & Rubber bands To retain moisture and expedite germination, cover the can with a square of plastic wrap and secure it with a rubber band.

INSTRUCTIONS

- Fill the can as shown
- Add just enough water to dampen the soil.
- Cover with plastic wrap.
- Place in a warm (70° F), sunny area.



LABELS

- Measure the diameter and height of your can, starting below the folded upper lip and ending within 1/8" of the bottom.
- Add 1/4" to the diameter for overlap.

When designing custom labels, leave this area blank for bleed
& center your logo/design in this area.
